*Preschool - Grade 2
60-minute Primary Programs*

Celebrate Chinese New Year

An introduction to the Chinese New Year Festival, students learn through hands-on stations with authentic clothing, objects and a make-and-take project that brings this celebration to life.

World Food: What Should I Eat?

Explore the use and impact of corn, rice and wheat in world cultures. Hands-on stations include measurement, setting an international table, and a make-and-take project.

This program explores how people's geographic location influences their choices in what to wear. Interactive stations include clothing to try on, a matching game with international dolls and an art project.

NEW! Discover Brazil

Through hand-on stations and activities, students explore three major regions of Brazil and how climate, geography and natural resources affect the way people live.

Grades 3-6

Welcome Home, Japan

Through the use of objects and art, students will explore a traditional Japanese home and learn how it is similar and different from their own home in this 75-minute program.

Students will explore the contrasts and common elements between homes in the cities and homes in the villages of Nigeria in this 75-minute program.
